START-UP FORMS

Each year we need families to complete a variety of forms. These include forms for walking field trips, medical, media, and technology. This year these forms are all online. SCHOOL SUPPLIES

Our school purchases the school supplies for the year in bulk so that all students in each class have what they need. Parents do not need to purchase supplies separately. Please send your child's school supply fees (\$50 per child) by Sept. 30th. If you require financial assistance for supply costs, please contact the office.

ONLINE PAYMENT FOR SCHOOL SUPPLIES

We now have SchoolCashOnLine available to all parents to make payments on line. Registering for a SchoolCash Online account is free and easy. Any future fees can be paid through this account.

3. Add your student in the system and pay online.

You may also pay for supplies by cheques made out to Lindsay Park. Please note your child's name in the memo line and what the funds are for. Deadline is September 30th.

MEDICAL ALERTS

If your child requires any medication or needs to carry an epi-pen due to allergic reactions, **PLEASE** ensure we have what we need at the school. For most medication to be administered at school we need a form completed and signed parents and a doctor to sign a form for school staff to administer medication, if needed.

CARP TRAINING

Are you interested in volunteering with your child's class? Each year, all staff and volunteers who work with children are required to complete Child Abuse Protection Protocol training. This 15 minute training will be offered just before our PAC meetings at 5:45pm. A Criminal Record Check is also required on file, but these are valid for five years. If you need to check on the status of your CRC, kindly contact the office.

BUSSING



All bus students who registered for the bus last year will be automatically registered this year. You will need to complete a new registration if you have moved since the end of June 2023. Students within 4 km of their closest school are considered courtesy riders.
